문제	<p>Using points and examples from the talk, describe two factors for disappearing lakes.</p>
모범답변	<p>In the lecture, the professor describes two factors for disappearing lakes by giving two examples.</p> <p>First of all, the professor talks about frequent droughts.</p> <p>He says that it's getting hotter and less rain falls each year because of climate change. This means that moisture evaporates a lot quicker than before. The example is about Lake Chad. It used to be one of the biggest lakes in Africa but repeated droughts have reduced it to one twentieth of its original size.</p> <p>Also, the professor talks about water diversion. He says that it's a way people interfere with water to use it for things like irrigation. Also, people have been diverting water more often because of increased population.</p> <p>The example is about the Aral Sea. It was one of the largest lakes in the world. However, its waters were diverted for irrigation projects and by the year 2007, its size had decreased by 90 percent.</p>
